In this way, parents are able to monitor all that is being taught in school as well as teach and discuss more sensitive subjects at home. Materials will be sent home with students for your review. Since April is Child Abuse Prevention month, Sharon McKee, Guidance Counselor will facilitate lessons and a project for **Messages that Protect**. The lesson will include showing a video from the Messages that Protect series and having a discussion around the video. Then each student will create a piece of art that depicts the particular message that the grade was assigned. Attached is a letter explaining these messages for each grade level.



Dear SJA Parent/Guardian,

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. This year, during the month of April, the Division of Catholic Schools is collaborating with the Office of Child and Youth Protection on an activity for elementary and middle school students throughout the Archdiocese of Baltimore. The activity invites students to use art to consider key child protection messages. The goal of the activity is to reinforce child protection messages that are integrated into the Catechesis for Family Life, an important component of the Religion curriculum in Catholic School in the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

Each grade has been assigned one of eight *Messages that Protect* (see table below). Students should illustrate their understanding of the assigned topic on a blank 8.5x11 sheet of paper. Students should write the *Message* they are illustrating somewhere on page. The student's name, grade, and school should be printed on the back. Students will discuss the activity in school but will complete the illustration at home, due April 30. Parents can find a short discussion prompt for each *Message* in the table below. The Office of Child and Youth Protection may use the illustrations for future training (identity of the artist will remain anonymous) and for display, in order to raise awareness of important child protection messages. Parents, you may request the Office of Child and Youth Protection not display your child's artwork. Please inform your child's teacher via email.

Grade	Message that Protects	Discussion Prompt	
Kindergarten	Always a Child of God: You are wonderfully made.	What makes you special?	
First	Language to Communicate Clearly: Sharing how you feel helps others know what you are thinking and feeling.	How do words help you?	
Second	Asking for Help: When you feel confused or "mixed-up", you can ask a parent or Trusted Adult for help.	Think about a time you asked for help and you were given it.	
Third	<i>Feelings:</i> Feelings are neither good nor bad; you need to know appropriate ways to express your feelings.	What are some feelings you've had recently and how did you express them?	

Fourth	<i>Promises:</i> There are many good promises, but sometimes you may make a promise that makes you feel uncomfortable. It is okay to break a promise for your safety or for the safety of others.	Think about a "good promise" you've made, why was it good?
Fifth	<i>Privacy and Boundaries:</i> You have a right to privacy and the right to set boundaries that others should not cross.	What boundaries do you have that protect you?
Sixth	<i>Secrets:</i> There is a difference between surprises, privacy, and secrets. People should not ask you to keep secrets from your parents or other Trusted Adults.	What is the difference between a secret and a surprise?
Seventh	<i>Respect the Body:</i> God made us in His image. Our bodies are different from one another. They are equally good and deserve respect.	We are all different, yet made in God's image. How do you show respect for others?
Eighth	Always a Child of God: Your brain, your body, and your soul are made to work together to live out your personal vocation. You have specific tools to help you do this safely.	What makes you unique and special? What attributes and tools do you possess to contribute to the world?
