The appearance of any young person is primarily the responsibility of that individual and his/her parents. We expect students to maintain the type of neatness and grooming that does not interfere with the health and safety of themselves or others, nor with the educational process or religious dimensionof the school. All uniforms must be clean, in good repair and properly fitted. All clothing must be labeled with the child's name.

Travel Guidance Reminder

As we move into the holiday seasons of Thanksgiving and Christmas, many will be traveling to visit family and for vacations. Please accept the following as a reminder relative to the requirements related to COVID-19 protocols upon return for those traveling.

Domestic Travel:

Currently there are no specific restrictions, testing or quarantine requirements relative to domestic travel being required by the CDC or the State of Maryland. If your school has implemented a more restrictive policy relative to domestic travel, a reminder of such policy is to be shared with your families as soon as possible. Domestic travel includes travel to any destination within the United States, including Alaska and Hawaii, and all United States possessions and territories.

International Travel:

For those planning international travel, you are referred to the guidance offered by the CDC regarding preparations for and returning from international travel. Please carefully review the following webpage: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/international-travel-during-covid19.html</u>

Specifically with regard to returning from international travel, you are referred to the section on the above referenced webpage entitled <u>"After Arrival in the United States"</u>. Those returning from international travel are expected to comply with the following guidance issued by the CDC:

ALL Travelers

- Get tested with a COVID-19 viral test 3-5 days after travel.
- Self-monitor for <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>; isolate and get tested if you develop symptoms.
- Follow all <u>state and local</u> recommendations or requirements after travel.

If the traveler is not fully vaccinated, in addition to the testing guidance above the individual must comply with the following requirements:

- Stay home and self-quarantine for a full 7 days after travel, even if you test negative at 3-5 days.
- If you don't get tested, stay home and self-quarantine for 10 days after travel.

As a reminder, the above protocols are subject to change if there are changes with regard to the spread of virus. If changes are required, families will be updated. However, family must comply with the guidance in force at the time of travel.
